



HONOURED GUEST: NOBEL IN ECONOMICS PRIZE LAUREATE, PROF. JAMES J. HECKMAN

James 1. Heckman has devoted his professional life to understanding the origins of major social and economic problems inequality, social related to mobility, discrimination, skill formation and regulation, and to devising and evaluating alternative strategies for addressing those problems. His work is rooted in economics, but he actively collaborates across disciplines to get to the heart of major problems. His recent interdisciplinary research on human development and skill formation over the life cycle draws on economics, psychology, genetics, epidemiology, and neuroscience to examine the origins of inequality, the determinants of social mobility, and the links among stages of the life cycle, starting in the womb.

In 2000, Heckman shared the Nobel Prize in **Economics** for his work on the microeconometrics of diversity and heterogeneity and for establishing a sound causal basis for public policy evaluation. He has received numerous other awards for his work, including the John Bates Clark Medal of the American Economic Association in 1983, the Jacob Mincer Award for Lifetime Achievement in 2005 from the Society of Labor Economics, the 2005 and 2007 Dennis Award for Aigner Applied Econometrics the Journal from of Econometrics, the Ulysses Medal from the University College Dublin in 2006,

the 2007 Theodore W. Schultz Award from American Agricultural **Economics** the Association, the Gold Medal of the President of the Italian Republic, awarded by the International Scientific Committee of the Pio Manzu Centre in 2008, the Distinguished Contributions to Public Policy for Children Award from the Society for Research in Child Development in 2009, and the Frisch Medal from the Econometric Society in 2014 for the outstanding paper in most applied economics published in Econometrica in the previous five years; the 2016 Dan David Prize; was made a Distinguished Fellow of the American Economic Association in 2017. and is the 2019 recipient of the Chinese Government Friendship Award.





ORDERING ACADEMIC Robes / Caps and gowns

Third, this especially for ladies, the procession walk from the ESE centre to the venue will be 1,2 Km, we suggest you bring comfortable shoes for the walk that may be changed at the moment of arrival at the venue - a special reserved spot will be available for this.

The Auditorium 400 of the Reina Sofia Museum is located in the heart of the musem, a work of the French architect Jean Nouvel. The Auditorium is accessed through the Nouvel Lobby, this floor-to-ceiling glass area boasts spectacular views of the central courtyard and Sabatini Building.

The square, paved with granite and an extension 'in the shadow' of the urban bustle, houses a piece by Lichtenstein, the artist with whom the new rooms were inaugurated.

Music will play, and the audience will rise as speeches and degree awards are presented to all registered students.


